Pitch

For the past two years, the pandemic has affected the world drastically, causing countries to close their borders, halt travel, and go into lockdown. For universities, this meant that there would be less international students, where according to Pew Research Center, there was at least a 15% decrease in enrollment from international students from 2020 to 2021. And for international students, this means deciding on pushing through and completing their education, or giving up and delaying the opportunity to study abroad. Universities then adapted to the situation and shifted many courses and programs to online learning. Now, countries are opening up their borders and recovering from COVID-19, but will the pandemic continue to impact the education system and future enrollments?

The feature will focus on the university's outlook on the education system as the world is recovering from the pandemic, and view the story of experiencing the pandemic from the perspective of both university staff and international students. This story will feature interviews with staff from University of Louisville's International Student and Scholar Services to explore how the education system has shifted, and if there will be any long term impact. There will also be interviews with a selection of international students from within University of Louisville and other universities in the United States, to find out how the pandemic has affected them and explore some reasons that made them stay to complete their studies amidst the pandemic. Interviews with students that moved to the United States during the pandemic will also be conducted to explore their choice of attending in-person classes instead of taking other options.
